

novaDISC 8 – Desktop and Online Version

Desktop- vs. Online-Version

novaDISC 8 is available both as a desktop version for local installation on the PC and as an online version.

Desktop version

System requirements

novaDISC 8 runs on Windows® 10, Windows® 8.1, Windows® 8, Windows® 7 and Windows® XP. A current .net framework 4.0 and the Windows Installer 4.5 need to be available too. The PC must be able to search the Microsoft website for updates during installation.

Downloading the software

Access to the relevant download link is possible free of charge via

novaDISC is installed locally on your computer via the Microsoft ClickOnce® process. This process installs novaDISC as an app in a protected area, so that the PC is not exposed to any dangers.

Installation of the software

1. Download and execute the file “Setup.exe”.
2. This installation routine now checks whether your PC meets the system requirements and downloads the necessary components directly from Microsoft if required.
3. The novaDISC software is subsequently downloaded and installed automatically.

Network requirements

The IT infrastructure must allow the “Setup.exe” to be downloaded and must permit Microsoft to check for any updates that are needed.

Updates

novaDISC checks automatically whether program updates are available and offers them for installation.

Installation via data storage media

Installation via a data storage medium may perhaps be requested in exceptional cases. For this purpose, the necessary system requirements must be provided manually, so that the novaDISC software itself can be installed. No automatic updates are made in this case. This form of installation should therefore only be used in exceptional cases.
